FIVE FINAL FOURS

Semifinals feature first-timers and traditional powers from all areas of the state

More than 400 football programs suited up this season with dreams of championships swirling in their heads. But here we are in December and only 20 teams remain. At risk tonight across the state are 10 berths in the state football finals.

FIVE ALIVE ...

Is this the year for Cobb County? When Marietta took home the hardware in 1967, the county had a fraction of the population it does now. But despite having 16 public schools and a handful of private academies in three different classifications, Cobb has still yet to win another state title.

But tonight, Cobb programs Lassiter and Walton play for a spot in the finals. The winner of that east Cobb battle will take on either Colquitt County or Grayson. Out of the foursome, only Colquitt County has won a state title (1994) and Rush Propst's Packers are back in the semifinals for the third straight season.

The Rams have turned into a perennial power under coach Mickey Conn, with five straight 10-win seasons and three semifinal berths in that period. Grayson is led by hulking defensive end and running back Robert Nkemdiche, who is being recruited by basically every major college program in America.

FOUR MORE ...

In a marquee showdown between Northside-Warner Robins and Tucker, two of the state's top programs in recent years will square off. The two Class AAAA powers have combined to win three state titles since 2006.

Coach Franklin Stephens' Tigers have been at or near the top of the Class AAAA polls since he took over in 2007. Tucker won the 2008 title but has not made another final under Stephens.

One of the state's most consistent programs, Northside has won 10 or more games every year since 1998, including state titles in 2006 and 2007. The Eagles beat Tucker in the semifinals on their way to the 2007 title after coming back from a 28-7 halftime deficit.

Facing the winner of Tucker-Northside will be either Lovejoy or Warner Robins. These are two programs on opposite ends of the tradition spectrum, as the Demons have won four state titles and are one of the state's traditional powers while Lovejoy is in its first semifinal ever.

TRIPLE CROWN ...

Following their shocking quarterfinals upset of two-time defending state champion Sandy Creek, the Gainesville Red Elephants move on to a semifinals date with Burke County. After a season-opening blowout loss to Buford, Gainesville has

been impressive in reeling off 12 straight wins. Through the first round of the playoffs, the Elephants scored 40 or more points in 10 consecutive games. Quarterback Deshaun Watson accounted for five touchdowns in the win over the Patriots.

Trying to slow down the herd of Red Elephants will be the Bears of Burke County. Eric Parker's program has won 10 straight since a loss to Lowndes in the third game of the year and has scored more than 30 points in all but two games this season. A strong running game headed up by quarterback Corey Mayton and running back Donnell Green leads the Bears' attack. The Bears will be on the road for the first time in the playoffs tonight.

TWO LIVE CREW ...

Can anyone stop Buford? That is the theme heading into the Class AA semifinals tonight.

The Wolves have won four consecutive state titles and have not been tested all year. In fact, their closest game was a 35-7 romp over tonight's opponent, Carver-Columbus, on Sept. 2.

However, since that loss, Carver has reeled off 11 straight wins in dominating fashion. Running back Marquez Holloway has replaced Isaiah Crowell with flying colors, having rushed for more than 1,000 yards this season. Holloway keyed Carver's 34-21 win over Fitzgerald in the quarterfinals by rushing for 248 yards and a touchdown.

In the other semifinal, Calhoun returns for fourth straight year. The Yellow Jackets have lost to Buford in the last three state finals games. Calhoun will be opposed by Appling County which is in the semis for the second time ever.

SINGLE A SCENE ...

For the first time since 2008, no Region 2 power will hold court in Class A. Savannah Christian, however, has returned to the semifinals for the third consecutive year in search of the Raiders' first GHSA state title. Coach Donald Chumley's squad has rolled through Class A this season, and passed a major test last week when it defeated previously-unbeaten Lincoln County 22-14.

Upstart Prince Avenue Christian has made the semifinals in just its second playoff appearance ever. The Athens school is led by quarterback Carl Mattox and running backs Rob Farris and Bryce Huff. Kicker Adam Hayden made two fourth quarter field goals in the 20-15 quarterfinals win over Bremen.

In the other matchup, Landmark Christian is in its first semifinal as well. The surprising War Eagles will face powerhouse Eagle's Landing Christian for a berth in the finals. The two programs met in the regular season, with ELCA taking a 35-14 decision.

CLASS AAAAAA PREVIEW

Colquitt County at Grayson

After taking down mighty Camden County 32-31 in the quarterfinals, the Colquitt County Packers will look to take down another powerhouse, as they battle the undefeated Grayson Rams. Packers QB Cole Seagraves' dramatic touchdown pass on fourth-and-goal with 33 seconds left, along with a two-point conversion, sent the Packers past Camden County and into a semifinal matchup against Grayson for the second straight season. Colquitt County won last season's game 31-24 before losing to Brookwood in the Class AAAAAA state championship game. The Packers will look for Seagraves to continue his solid play and help orchestrate more magic in order to take down a tough Rams team.

Colquitt County has made it a habit of knocking out the elite teams in this postseason. Prior to beating Camden County, the Packers ousted another powerhouse on the road at North Gwinnett. For Colquitt County to upset Grayson once again, it will have to stop the Rams' stout running game, led by Wayne Gallman and Robert Nkemdiche, who scored four touchdowns in the Rams' 33-7 quarterfinal victory over West Forsyth. Also in the Rams' victory, quarterback Nick Schuessler threw for 100 yards and a touchdown. With the exception of a few close contests, Grayson has spent much of the season steamrolling its opponents on the way to an undefeated record.

Standing in the Rams' way of finishing 15-0, however, is a Packers team that shares the same level of big game experience. Both teams expect their experience to be a key factor in not only their semifinal matchup, but also against either Walton or Lassiter, neither of which has ever been to a state championship game. Colquitt is also the only team in the Class AAAAAA semifinals with a state championship, which occurred in 1994. With several intriguing storylines surrounding the latest chapter in the Grayson/Colquitt County rivalry, this semifinal matchup between two of the top programs in the state is sure to be another highly-contested clash.

Lassiter at Walton

Coming off an upset win against M.L. King in the quarterfinals, the Lassiter Trojans will look to continue their magical postseason run against the Walton Raiders at Raider Valley. This will be the second matchup between two of eastern Cobb County's elite programs, as Walton took the first game, touted as the "Super Bowl of East Cobb" 34-10 at home.

After winning their first two playoff games by a combined four points, the Trojans were able to jump on the highly-ranked Lions early and never looked back en route to a 24-14 victory. Lassiter quarterback Eddie Printz hopes to lead his team to an astounding fourth straight road victory in this year's postseason, but he will have to do so against a Walton team that, up until last week's close contest against Dacula, had been averaging 45 points per game in postseason play while only surrendering an average of 10 points per game.

The Raiders did show some vulnerability in their 21-13 quarterfinal game against the Falcons. Seventeen penalties nearly cost the Raiders their perfect season but key defensive plays, including Zack Blaylock's interception in the endzone with 16 seconds left, helped preserve the hard-fought victory. Phenom Tyren Jones, rushed for 141 yards and scored two of Walton's touchdowns, one on a 62-yard punt return.

For Walton to avoid becoming Lassiter's fourth straight road victim, the Raiders will need to eliminate mental mistakes and keep Printz in check, as he hopes to lead the Trojans to an improbable state title game berth. Lassiter will need to find a way to consistently stop Jones, who tallied 140 rushing yards to go along with a touchdown in the teams' first meeting this season. Both teams will be looking to become the first team from the East Cobb area to reach the state finals since 1973, when Wheeler reached the title game.






CLASS AAAA PREVIEW

Tucker at Northside-Warner Robins

Tucker (13-0) will be squaring off against Northside-Warner Robins (13-0). These teams faced off in the 2007 semifinals in a 31-28 comeback victory by the Eagles. This year's matchup looks to provide just as much drama as both teams enter the game undefeated and have been among the favorites to reach the Dome all year.

Both teams have high-powered offenses with the Eagles averaging 35.3 points per game and the Tigers posting an incredible 44.7 points per game during the playoffs. Tucker won a shootout in the quarterfinals over Flowery Branch, 42-34. The Tigers' offense is led by quarterback Juwaan Williams and running back Jordan Landry. Williams tallied three rushing touchdowns against the Falcons and Landry added another two scores on the ground. The Tigers' offense was able to overcome their defense's lackluster performance giving up 515 yards of offense. In this semifinals matchup the Tucker defense will need to perform better against the very talented Northside offense in order to pull out the victory.

Northside will look to exploit the Tigers' defense that was exposed by Flowery Branch's high-powered offense. The Eagles' offense will look to ride running back/wide receiver Miguel Williams to the finals after his 177-yard, three-touchdown performance against Tri-Cities in the quarterfinals. What may be the difference in this game is the Eagles' defense that is coming off of a very impressive performance in the quarterfinals. They held Tri-Cities to 99 total yards of offense and eight points. But the Tucker offense will offer an enormous challenge for the Northside defense, too. Both offenses have been rolling through the playoffs, and this matchup could produce a lot of scoring.

Warner Robins at Lovejoy

The Warner Robins Demons (11-2) will face off against the Lovejoy Wildcats (13-0) in a Class AAAA semifinal matchup at Twelve Oaks Stadium tonight. Lovejoy has ridden its defense to this point, posting eight shutouts on the season including a 14-0 victory over Ware County in the quarterfinals. The Lovejoy offense has not had to score much during its playoff run due to the suffocating defense, but running back Travis Custis has provided the necessary offensive output for the Wildcats. Against Ware County, Custis rushed for 203 yards on 24 carries and accounted for both Lovejoy touchdowns. Custis and the rushing attack help control the clock and limit the number of possessions opponents get against the stingy Wildcats defense, and this style has worked all year to the tune of 13 victories and no defeats.

Warner Robins will be looking to find a way to break down the Wildcats defense and continue the Demons' improbable run this season. The resurgent Demons have long been a powerful program with four state titles as recently as 2004, but Warner Robins has missed the playoffs the last four years. Warner Robins has proven it can win any type of game during these playoffs, winning a shootout in the first round over Lakeside-Evans, before winning a pair of low-scoring games including a 20-10 quarterfinals victory over East Paulding. This matchup should prove to be a physical, defensive game that will be won in the trenches. The Demons' defensive line will need to control the point of attack against the Wildcats' offense line in order to stop the strong rushing attack of Lovejoy. The Warner Robins' offense will need to do something no team has been able to all year: solve the Wildcats' defense in order to advance to the final.

CLASS AAA PREVIEW

Burke County at Gainesville

After stunning a Sandy Creek team that had won 41 straight games, Gainesville looks to ride the momentum into a semifinals matchup against Burke County. The Red Elephants won the coin toss on Saturday to gain homefield advantage.

Throughout the season, quarterback Deshaun Watson and wideout Caleb Hayman have led the Red Elephants' offense and hope to continue that in tonight's game. During the 35-21 victory over Sandy Creek, Watson finished 25-for-35 passing with 220 yards and five total touchdowns, two of which went to Hayman.

In order to stop the Bears of Burke County, Gainesville must have another impressive defensive outing. With dual-threat quarterback Corey Mayton leading the Bears, Gainesville will have to try to slow him down through the air and on the ground. Last week, the senior gained 146 total yards in the Bears' 32-28 quarterfinal victory over Allatoona. The Bears rushed for 220 total yards on the Buccaneers with running back Donquell Green leading the team with 84 yards on 14 carries.

The semifinal appearance marks the second consecutive trip for the Bears and third all-time, while Gainesville advanced for the first time since 2009. This experience has given many of the players the mentality of what it takes to win in a high-profile game. Even with both programs' successes over the years, this will mark the first-ever meeting between the two teams.

Burke County hopes it can get to the championship game this year after losing 49-15 to Carrollton last season in the semifinals. Gainesville, on the other hand, seeks to return to the finals for the first time since 2009 when they lost to Peach County.

Cairo at Peach County

The matchup between Cairo and Peach County pits two former region foes against one another. The two teams split two meetings when they met as members of Region 1-AAA in 2008 and 2009; the winner of each meeting eventually went on to win the state title. In 2008, Cairo defeated the Trojans en route to an undefeated season while Peach County followed suit in 2009 by putting together an undefeated season of its own. With this game preceding the state title game, the stakes are higher than ever.

Coming off a 19-15 victory over Carrollton, junior wideout Demarcus Robinson, who already has offers from Florida and Georgia, looks to have another impressive performance against the Syrupmakers. Last week the receiver caught three passes, one of which went 76 yards for a score to lead the Trojans to victory. He also had a game-ending interception in the end zone to clinch the win. Meanwhile, quarterback Kentel Kendrick accounted for three total touchdowns.

In order to pull out another victory, Peach County will need to contain the Syrupmakers' rushing attack led by running back Terrell Cason. In last week's quarterfinal victory over St. Pius X, Cason finished with two scores while senior quarterback Steven Bench added 127 yards on the ground.

The matchup for both teams presents different problems than each faced from their quarterfinal challengers, as the Trojans offer more of a passing attack than St. Pius X, while the Syrupmakers have more of a heavy ground game. Peach County looks to win its fourth state title since 2005 and the Syrupmakers seek their third in 20 years. If history repeats itself, then the winner of this game would win the state title.

CLASS AA PREVIEW

Buford at Carver-Columbus

When Buford and Carver-Columbus kick it off in the semifinals, there will be plenty of familiarity. “Familiarity” as in these teams have played each other in each of the last two regular seasons during the non-region portion of the schedule, and “familiarity” as in both schools are used to making deep playoff runs every fall.

Buford is the four-time defending state champion, dating back to 2007. Carver-Columbus won the Class AAA title in 2007, and has been to at least the quarterfinals in Class AA or AAA every year since 2006.

In September, coach Jess Simpson’s Wolves defeated Carver-Columbus 35-7 in Buford, but in 2010, the Tigers beat Buford 14-0 at Kinnett Stadium in Columbus. It was Buford’s only loss since early 2009. For this meeting, Carver-Columbus will use Memorial Stadium as its home turf in the semifinal.

Both teams have dominated opponents on both sides of the ball in their quest for a state championship.

The least amount of points Buford has scored in any game is 28, and that includes the three playoff victories. Quarterback Sam Clay is an accomplished passer, but he also likes to hand the ball off to a stable of more than capable running backs, including linebacker/fullback Nathan Staub. In Buford’s 49-13 quarterfinal win over Elbert County, Staub accounted for two touchdowns and led the Wolves’ stifling defense. Buford has only allowed one team to score 14 points this season.

Tigers coach Dell McGee will rely on a dominant running game featuring Marquez Holloway. Holloway, listed at 5-foot-7, rushed for 248 yards and a touchdown in the Tigers’ 34-21 quarterfinal win over Fitzgerald. Much like Clay, quarterback Torrance McGee is also a dual-threat weapon for the Tigers. He rushed for two scores and tossed another against Fitzgerald. Carver-Columbus has held nine teams to eight or fewer points in 2011.

Appling County at Calhoun

When Calhoun hosts Appling County in their semifinal matchup, it will be a game pitting a powerhouse program against an up-and-coming team.

Calhoun, the Region 7 champion, is a perennial power, known for its high scoring offense. The Yellow Jackets have scored more than 60 points twice this season and have broken the 40-point mark eight times. The Yellow Jacket defense has been effective as well, with two shutouts in 2011.

Deep playoff runs are nothing new for Calhoun (13-0). The Yellow Jackets are the three time Class AA runners-up (losing each time to another 2011 semifinalist, Buford). Coach Hal Lamb will rely on a familiar face to guide his offense: his nephew Taylor Lamb. In last week’s 45-7 road win at Dublin, Lamb rushed for two touchdowns and threw for two more. The Yellow Jackets were stingy against Dublin’s powerful Wing-T rushing attack, only allowing three yards rushing in the first half.

Appling County is coming off a thrilling four-overtime 35-33 road victory over Lamar County in the quarterfinals. Also on their 2011 resume is a 28-21 win over Coffee County, a play-off team from possibly the state’s best region in any classification, Region 1-AAAAA.

This is the Pirates fourth straight playoff appearance, but their first trip to the semifinals since 1999. Coach J.T. Pollock’s team’s only loss in 2011 was on the road in the final game of the regular season to Region 2-rival Pierce County, 21-14. On offense, Appling County likes to run and throw out of a spread formation, utilizing the arm and legs of quarterback LaShune Moore. C.J. Nails has contributed on both sides of the ball for the Pirates. On offense he is a punishing running back, and on defense, he is a run stopper at the nose guard position.

Many people looked at the brackets and thought ELCA could make a final four run, but it is likely few thought Landmark Christian would be one of the four teams remaining. The War Eagles have gone on the road to knock off a one seed, a two seed and a three seed, and are just one of two No. 4 seeds remaining in the state title hunt.

In the 28-21 quarterfinal win over Aquinas, Cantrell Frazier rushed for 71 yards and threw the game-winning screen pass to Jeremiah Kirkland. Kirkland also rushed for 118 yards in the victory. Frazier is a converted receiver playing quarterback. Sam Dobbs does a little bit of everything for Landmark Christian, lining up at quarterback, safety, kick returner and wide receiver. It is at the wide receiver spot where the 6-foot-4 freshman will likely make his mark at the next level. Dobbs will head to San Antonio in January to play in the Eastbay Youth All-American Bowl. Josh Nobles is also a threat on the outside.

Eagles Landing Christian Academy can boast one of the nation's top juniors in running back Keyante Green, though he has been slowed recently with a groin injury. The Chargers have turned to a stable of other backs to help get them to the semifinals and that stable has stepped up. John Tatum, Dalton Etheridge and Joe Walker have each toted the rock when head coach Jonathan Gess has called their number. Walker rushed for 100 yards and three touchdowns in the Chargers' 51-7 thumping of Seminole County in the quarterfinals. Green is now healthy and could be a force in the semifinal game. Tatum has eclipsed 1,500 yards rushing this season and has 31 touchdowns. ELCA has defeated Mt. Paran, Greenville and Seminole to reach the final four. The Chargers finished the regular season with a 6-0 region record, including a 35-14 win over Landmark Christian on Oct. 14.

Prince Avenue Chr. at Savannah Chr.

Savannah Christian won a coin toss, meaning Prince Avenue Christian had to make the near nine-hour drive for this game. When they do arrive, this battle of two undefeated region champions should be an incredible matchup. Savannah Christian has made the last two Class A championships games and is eyeing a third straight.

Will Austin and Nardo Garvin lead the SCPS rushing attack, while defensive standout DeAngelo Brown heads a stout defense which held mighty Lincoln County to just 14 points. Josh Gay and Michael Burke join Brown to form the defensive front in a 3-4 look. The defense has given up just seven points per game in the playoffs, up slightly from the 5.6 per game during the regular season. The offense averages around 40 points per contest, with last week's 22 points being the lowest total of the year. The Raiders have beaten Dooly County (37-0), Bowdon (38-7) and Lincoln County (22-14) to reach the semifinals. In the last two years, SCPS has beaten Wesleyan and Darlington at this stage before falling in the title game. The Raiders won Region 3-A.

Prince Avenue forced four turnovers in the Wolverines' 20-15 victory over Bremen. The reason for the Wolverines' run, though, has been their explosive offense. The offensive line has been mashing opposing defenses while allowing the running game to churn up yardage to the tune of 328 yards and 31.7 points per game. Prince Avenue has rushed for nearly 4,000 yards this season. Wingback Rob Farriba and quarterback Carl Mattox have a firm grasp on the offense for coach Mark Farriba. Both players also excel for a defense that gives up just seven points per game. On special teams, Prince Avenue Christian has to like the cold-blooded leg of Adam Hayden, who nailed two second-half field goals to knock off Bremen. The Wolverines have previously taken down Charlton County 21-3 and Washington Wilkes 21-8 after winning Region 8-A.
