A Life Dedicated to and Lived In the Pursuit of Excellence

Morris Bryan died at the age of 65. His life was full of accomplishments and recognition for those accomplishments. He was an intense man. When he believed in something, he pursued it with unequalled energy and enthusiasm. When he had an idea, his mind was capable of creating the picture of the completed project, including the mechanics by which the idea could be developed into reality.

The dreams were heavily weighed by their fairness and benefit to others. He disliked the limelight of headlines and many times would give credit for success to others. The idea and dream of the Georgia Olympics was his. He believed in it. It was one of the highlights of his life — worked on, studied, continually improved, always devising ways so that others could share his enthusiasm for the event and the sport of Track and Field;

adding ways in which the achievement of excellence could be recognized. Why?

To set goals and work at their fulfillment or attainment. To pursue excellence. To champion winning as opposed to the acceptance of mediocrity. To foster teamwork and motivation. To create and encourage the desire for one's personal best in all things. To foster good sportsmanship. To reward or recognize excellence. To encourage competition to the end of more and more excellence. To bring together athletes, coaches, spectators and community in the pursuit of that which benefits all. To teach "suck it up and go" in the face of disappointments and hardships.

Morris Bryan was the Georgia Olympics and the event is Morris Bryan. Though the dreamer is not present, the dream lives on. We share that dream. As long as we are honored with the opportunity to host this event, we pledge our personal best effort every time out!

The Morris M. Bryan Memorial Trophy is awarded each year to the athlete who is the outstanding performer over all sessions and classifications of Georgia Olympics.

A life dedicated in celebrating gifts to others

Tom Bryan would not approve of this recognition. He would have actively sought to have it suppressed. His name never appeared in this program before, because he would not hear of it.

Tom Bryan shunned the spotlight, always believing that all are called to serve quietly and without fanfare. He loved nature and respected his place within, for the same reason. His infectious laughter was a renewal of spirit to all who heard it, often in midst of his own pain.

The Spirit of the Georgia Olympics was a shared affair between Tom, his brother Morris and the community of Jefferson. The idea worked because they wanted to bring together the best athletes in the state so all could see and be exposed to each others' efforts. The statement was born here, "That exposure to excellence prompts excellence." It also worked because no one here sought the recognition, heaping it instead on the competitors, past and present.

Morris was the voice of the Olympics, but he often referred to Jack Keen and his brother Tom as the heart and soul of the Georgia Olympics. Greatness is never worn by those that are; rather they seek anonymity, thereby showing others the path to greatness.

As you enjoy the performances of these great athletes and celebrate their accomplishments, victories and personal bests; join with those of us who knew Tom and Morris and thank them for their lifelong dedications to the pursuit of excellence.



Rebekah Bryan

Rebekah Bryan's love for track and field and athletics in general started at an early age. Her step-father was legendary Georgia Tech football coach and athletic director William A. Alexander. She grew up spending much of her time at athletic events and with the coaches and athletes participating in them. Rebekah's work with the Georgia Olympics began with its inception and was always a labor of love. For many years she spent countless hours preparing for the event. Before the advent of the personal computer she meticulously filled out index cards and assigned numbers to all the competing athletes at the Olympics. It seemed every flat surface at her home was filled with the information needed to reward athletes for their individual performances. In the early days of the Georgia Olympics, she hosted a social event at her home for coaches and visiting dignitaries. As the years passed she gradually took on lesser roles, but her love for the event continued until her death.



THE OPERATION OF GEORGIA OLYMPICS

UMPIRES:

Spectators as well as contestants will observe judges with flags around the track on all running events. These men observe all possible violations of track rules and when contestants pass their area of jurisdiction, wave a white flag, meaning everything is "O.K." or a yellow flag, indicating a possible infraction or violation.

On relay races, a yellow flag can mean that the baton was passed outside legal zone, or that a runner was out of his lane, or that a runner cut in front of another too quickly.

On a race involving no lanes, 800 meters, 1600 meters or 3200 meters, a yellow flag can mean a runner cut in too quickly, not giving the other runner one stride distance before doing so.

On hurdle races, a yellow flag could identify a hurdler that did not get both feet over the hurdle plane. If one foot was lagged or allowed to drag below the hurdle height, he would be disqualified, and a yellow flag would be flown by a Georgia Olympic umpire.

TENT SPACE:

No individual team tents will be permitted on the field inside the fence where the track is located.

WIND GAUGES:

For a national record to be recognized in certain events, there cannot be a following or tail wind exceeding two meters per second, which is 4.473 miles per hour. The events are:

1. Long Jump
2. Triple Jump
3. 100 Meter Dash
4. 110 Meter Hurdles
5. 200 Meter Dash

(In these events the wind gauge is located about halfway down the runway.)

Note: One gauge located halfway applies at all times.)

AWARDS:

At the conclusion of all final events, the first 8 finishers must go immediately to the victory stand. Winners will be announced and medals presented before the next event is begun. You must go to the victory stand promptly so that we can stay on schedule while recognizing you and your achievement. GHSA in conjunction with Georgia Farm Bureau, awards medals for 1st and 2nd place. Third through eighth place medals will be provided by the Atlanta Track Club.

ANNOUNCEMENTS OF EVENTS:

First Call will be given 15 minutes before each event. Contestants must report immediately to the Clerk of Course. His position is identified on the infield by sign marked CLERK. Calls for field events will also be given. On final call, contestants must report to the official for his event.

Last Call will be given 5 minutes before race. Contestants must report immediately to the starters. Remember: The order of running in each final event will be A, AA, AAA, AAAA, AAAAA and AAAAAA.

SPLITS: All individual races with more than one lap will have “splits” announced over the loud speaker for the first six runners at each lap.

WEIGH DISCUS AND SHOT:

Scales are located at the white building adjacent to the shot put area. All shot and discus must be weighed and checked before using. The implement must carry the mark of approval for Georgia Olympics, otherwise they cannot be used.

PRINCIPLES OF ADVANCEMENT:

(2013 Track and Field Rules Book | The National Federation of State High School Association and the GHS Bylaws)

In the two heat races, the athletes for the finals are chosen by place over time. Advancement from sectional to state and state preliminaries to finals: Top two finishers of each heat and the next four faster times.

In the first round competition only, if two contestants from the same team fall within the same heat, move the slow runner to another heat by interchanging with a runner of nearest comparable place and time (weighing **place** first and **time** second).

COACHES PASSES FOR ADMISSION TO FIELD:

With the exception of field events, all coaches must obtain from the information booth (located at the top of the stadium at the end of the press box) a special FIELD PASS for admission to the field or track area. If for any reason a coach must go on the track or field, he must obtain a FIELD PASS. When the business has been transacted, he then returns the PASS to the information booth. There will be stationed in the stands, among the spectators, and at each gate on the field, a patrol to eliminate any unauthorized people on the field. This will eliminate some confusion occurring in years past and make it better for judges, timers and spectators to see what needs to be seen. Thank you very much for your cooperation.

Coach Gunn is a graduate of Marist School and The University of Georgia. He taught math at Riverwood High School for four years while coaching football, basketball, soccer and track. He returned to UGA to be a graduate assistant for football while earning a master's degree in secondary math education. In 1991, he joined the math department at Athens Academy and assumed the role of head football coach. While at Athens Academy, Coach Gunn has also coached soccer, basketball, tennis and track. His teaching duties have been in Geometry, Trigonometry, Statistics, Pre-Calculus and Calculus.

Terry Canup — Assistant Starter

Coach Canup has been coaching track and field as well as football since 1984. He started his career at Carrollton High School, then went to Screven Co., Gainesville, and finally to Commerce where he is the Assistant Principal. He graduated from Commerce in 1979 and received his B.S. and M. ED. in Physical Education & Health from West Georgia, and has a Specialist degree from Lincoln Memorial University. He is married to Pam and has three children.

GEORGIA OLYMPICS SHOT PUT BEST PERFORMANCE

FRED BERMAN TROPHY

When Fred Berman broke the Southeastern Conference shot put record in 1956, the mark he erased had been a world record when it was set by LSU's Jack Torrance in 1933. Fred competed for the Marine Corps for three years between his sophomore and junior years at Georgia Tech and had the opportunity of training and competing with many world class athletes during his time. As a result of this exposure, he was one of the first in the South to introduce weight lifting into shot and discus training — a factor that carried him to a Tech shot record of 56', 4-1/4". In 1957, he was conference champion in both discus and shot. It is an especially pleasant sidelight that our own coach — Jack Keen — was a pole vaulter and triple jumper on the same Tech team on which Fred competed. On September 7, 1979, Fred was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletic Hall of Fame.

GEORGIA OLYMPICS POLE VAULT BEST PERFORMANCE

BILLY WEEKS TROPHY

No improvement, whether in facilities or equipment, has been as dramatic as that in the Pole Vault. Fiberglass poles with flexibility of literally throwing the vaulter upward with little or no concern of how he lands since he falls on foam rather than sawdust, almost make pole vaulting a different game. Billy Weeks, a great Tech athlete from 1938 to 1941, was a pole vaulter of the earlier game. In the past, vaulters used a bamboo cane pole about 3" in diameter, heavy to carry and probably flexed only about 1". He depended on speed, muscle and body spring to do the job. The pole was a means and not an assist. Billy was SEC Champ, vaulting 13' 6" to win in 1941. In those days, it was a real triumph, and all that knew him would like to know just how high he could vault with today's facilities. Billy is a member of the Georgia Tech Athletic Hall of Fame, and is retired from Sears, Roebuck in Atlanta. We salute him for his athletic accomplishments and for what he has achieved in life — more than it would have been had track and field not been a part of his development.

GEORGIA OLYMPICS TRIPLE JUMP BEST PERFORMANCE

LEWIS GAINNEY TROPHY

One of the greatest performers in University of Georgia Bulldogs track history is Lewis Gainney. Lewis served as Head Track Coach at UGA for about 15 years. The Cairo native captained Georgia in 1965. He won the SEC Long Jump that year with an SEC meet record leap of 24'. He also won the Triple Jump with 49' 1-1/2".

Following graduation in 1966, Gainney won the United States Track and Field Federation Long Jump with 24' 10-1/2" and the Triple Jump with 50' 6-3/4". Earlier, in Atlanta, he had his career best long jump with 25' 3" in the Southwestern USTAFF Meet.

In March 1977, Gainney started the Georgia Relays, which includes colleges and Georgia high schools. In 1982, Lewis was named SEC Coach of the Year and was an assistant coach for the National Junior Pan-American Team. His athletes earned many NCAA All-American honors and individual indoor and outdoor conference championships. In 1984, his 400-meter relay team won the NCAA championship. He has coached several Olympians.

ED HAMM TROPHY

Ed Hamm was the first man from colleges in the United States to receive international Olympic recognition. He did well on the track in the 100, 220 and 440, but his real claim to fame was the Long Jump on the Olympic Team in 1928. After stellar performances wearing the gold and white at Georgia Tech, he set an Olympic record in Amsterdam with a jump of 25' 3" and came away as the first Georgian to claim an Olympic Gold Medal. His record stood for eight years. He later set a world record of 25' 11-3/4" which stood until the great Jesse Owens broke it in 1936. Ed was named to the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame in 1982. He lived in Portland, OR, but traveled in order to attend Georgia Olympics XI in 1982.

The Southeastern Conference Championship for the Two Mile belonged to him for three consecutive years in the time period of 1936-38 and three times he was on the SEC Cross Country championship squad. He was the 1938 Georgia Tech track captain and was considered among the top four Two Milers in the U.S.A. during the years 1935-36. Chick once held Georgia Tech records for both the One Mile (4:20.8) and Two Mile (9:21.2). In 1938, Chick was handed a diploma in one hand and orders to report for service in World War II in the other. He joined the Air Force and served as Lieutenant. Chick was killed in action in China in 1944.

TRADITIONAL POWERS MULTIPLE PROGRAMS BOAST PROLIFIC SUCCESS

As much as anyone can count on beautiful blooms and increasing temperatures as a sure sign that May has arrived, one can also expect Georgia's top athletes to make their way to Jefferson to take part in the Georgia Olympics. The GHSO Track and Field state championships take place each and every year at Memorial Stadium in Jefferson, and after the decision was made to hold all of the class championships at one site, the event rightfully earned the title "Georgia Olympics."

Folks in attendance can count on seeing new state records as well as performances worthy of All-American distinction and many of those performances have come from some of the same programs year after year. With so many amazing performers taking part in the Georgia Olympics each year, it is incredible that some programs have managed to rise above and stand out from the rest.

Programs such as Southwest DeKalb, Landmark Christian, Carrollton and Stephenson have annually taken home both individual and team titles as they are four of the most prestigious programs in the state.

Southwest DeKalb has captured eight

GHSO titles since 1987 with the program's heyday lasting throughout most of the 1990s. The Panthers won the Class AAAA title in 1990 before winning back-to-back crowns in 1993 and 1994 and then three straight from 1995 through 1997. Southwest DeKalb's most recent team title came in 2007.

During the incredible run from 1995 through 1997, the Panthers had two of the greatest track and field athletes ever to grace Memorial Stadium in Angelo Taylor and Terrance Trammell. Taylor won the Morris M. Bryan Memorial Trophy as the Georgia Olympics' most outstanding performer in 1995 and Trammell captured the prize in 1997. Taylor earned the award after earning more points than any other AAAA athlete that year, a feat he repeated in 1996 as he would win the Herman J. Stegeman Award. Trammell outscored the rest of AAAA in 1997 en route to the Morris M. Bryan award. Kelly Carter (1986, 1987), Hason Graham (1990) and Corey Taylor (1999) also earned the prize during Southwest DeKalb's incredible run under Raymond Bonner and Napoleon Cobb. Several of Trammell's individual class records still

stand today. The Southwest DeKalb program has also boasted such incredible athletes as Kim Carter, Chris Morris and Malcolm Brock over the years.

LANDMARK ACCOMPLISHMENTS ...

When the Landmark Christian Academy program is discussed, many people immediately think of legendary coach Bill Thorn (pictured right). An honorary meet director for the 37th Georgia Olympics, Thorn will be forever linked to the Landmark Christian School. He not only helped found the track and cross country programs, but he is one of the founding members of the school. Under Thorn, the boys track and field program won eight titles between 1996 and 2008 with two additional runner-up finishes. His seven straight state titles from 1996-2002 is the longest consecutive stretch in the modern era.



Thorn has had his share of tremendous athletes including Nathan Kosibi and Matt Day, the latter winning the Morris M. Bryan Memorial Trophy in 1996, but Thorn never once had one athlete win the Herman J. Stegeman Award for collecting the most points in the class. Thorn won his titles on the strength of the team, something that helped him capture so many team titles in a highly individualized sport. Kosibi's 3200-meter run in 1999 was one for the ages, and Day's 1600-meter run in 4:17.02 was a remarkable feat in 1996, the fastest time in the single-A classification.

Stephenson has plenty of history at the Georgia Olympics. The Jaguars of coach Don Sellers were major players in the early 2000s, winning the Class AAAAA title in 2002. Stephenson featured Michael Grant, who won the 200-meter dash in 2003 and the 100-meter dash in 2003 and 2004. He also took home the Class AAAAA Herman J. Stegeman Award in 2003. Sellers has also coached Joshua Walker and several relay teams to not just state titles but Georgia Olympics top performances.





UNTOUCHABLE TROJANS ...

Any discussion of the Georgia Olympics and boys track and field in the state of Georgia isn't complete without talking about the Carrollton program. Carrollton has won the last three Class AAA team titles and won three of four from 2002-2005. Unlike many other programs in the state, though, Carrollton has staying power. Carrollton captured its first title in 1955 and won seven total from 1955 through 1963, including six straight at one point. After managing to win just one state crown from 1964 through 1979, the program returned with a resounding fury, snagging seven in the 1980s. During the 1990s, Carrollton won five titles (three AAA and two AA).

In recent years, standouts such as Reggie Brown, Robert Kondelin, Montrell McClellon, John Wynn, Alex Shell, Willie Smith, Arthur Boykin, Jerome Winters, Steve Hicks, Justin Jones, O'Darine Bassett and Jonathan Jones have suited up for the Trojans and their storied program. Head coach Craig Musselwhite has led the team to six team titles and was an assistant for three other title squads. Musselwhite knows what it takes to churn out state champions as he has helped more than 50 athletes earn individual titles, and he has overseen countless other relay teams.

Two Carrollton athletes have been awarded the Morris M. Bryan Memorial Trophy: Shell won it in 1986 and O'Darine Bas-

sett took it home in 2004. Jones didn't win the Bryan Trophy last year, but he was once again the AAA Herman J. Stegeman Award winner.

Southwest DeKalb, Stephenson, Carrollton and Landmark Christian aren't the only legendary programs that have dominated the Georgia high school boys track and field championships. Many other programs have made their mark at the Georgia Olympics. Under the direction of Jamie Glover, Sandy Creek won back-to-back Class AAA state titles in 2007 and 2008. Christian Taylor certainly helped the Patriots' cause with a pair of individual titles in the triple jump for both of those teams. His championship leap in 2008 of 52' 6.5" still stands as the the best mark not just in AAA history but in Georgia Olympics history. Athens Christian has captured three Class A titles since 2007 including the last two while Cedar Shoals won three from 2002-2005. Fitzgerald captured four straight titles from 1987 through 1990, and Griffin won six titles between 1976 and 1985.

DeKalb and Carroll aren't the only dominant counties at the Georgia Olympics in Jefferson. Gwinnett County has proven that it is great over the last four years in the state's largest classification. Brookwood has won two titles in the last three years while Parkview and Peachtree Ridge each have a title during the current successful Gwinnett run. Since the late 1990s, Cobb County has been a ma-

ior player. Marietta has taken home four state titles while McEachern has earned three. The programs shared a championship in 2008. Wheeler took the top team prize in 2003 and last year, Kell brought the Class AAAA title back to Cobb. Last year, Kell brought the Class AAAA boys title back to Cobb County.

Jefferson, the host school, is another program that has experienced its fair share of success. The Dragons most recently won the 2010 Class AA title after winning the 2004 Class A crown. From 1970 through 1983, Jefferson won five titles. Since 1959, the Jefferson program has won nine GHSA boys track and field state team titles. Marc Mason captured the Class A Herman J. Stegeman Award to help the Dragons win a second straight title in 1978 while James Hardman won the award in 1983. Interestingly enough, Chris Keen won the Class AA Herman J. Stegeman Award in 1986 and 1988 but Central-Carrollton and Washington-Wilkes finished higher the first year and Fitzgerald won the team trophy the second year. Josh Kles was the 2010 winner of the award, the last time Jefferson won the team title.

With reclassification, many old rivalries were ended while new rivalries were created. It will be interesting this year to follow along as many of the DeKalb County powers compete against one another for not just county bragging rights but for state bragging rights. In years past M.L. King and Stephenson runners wouldn't see Tucker or Southwest DeKalb standouts at the Georgia Olympics, but each of those former team champions can meet for the AAAAA title along with 2001 champion Mays and 2009 champion Miller Grove. Elbert County, the 2011 AA champion, will now compete in a suddenly-wide open Class AAA after Carrollton moved to AA. Only Chapel Hill (2004), St. Pius X (2006) and Swainsboro (2007) have won titles since 2000.

Will a new program rise to the forefront and lay the groundwork for a future dynasty at these Georgia Olympics? In 40 years will we look back and say that is when a particular program started its incredible run? Will a familiar program add another thrilling chapter to its glorious legacy? While it can be comforting to see familiar programs do well, it is a treat for any track and field enthusiast to sit in Memorial Stadium and watch these athletes compete for the ultimate prize: a spot in the fabled lore of the Georgia High School Association's Georgia Olympics.

MATT DAY

1996 GEORGIA OLYMPICS OUTSTANDING PERFORMER AWARD WINNER & 3 TIME BEST PERFORMANCE AWARD WINNER



Matt Day began his high school running career at Landmark Christian School in the Spring of 1994. As a freshman, he placed 3rd in Class A in the 800 Meters.

Day would never lose another race at Georgia Olympics for the remainder of his high school career. He won the 800- and 1600-meter races three consecutive years, was a 3-time All-Classification winner (twice in the 800 and once in the 1600), set 2 state records, and won the Morris M. Bryan Jr. Award in 1996 scoring 80.25 points (the second most points scored for the award at that time). Day picked up cross country in the latter part of his school career, winning a cross country state title in 1996. Day won 7 individual state titles, and was part of four team state titles.

Day began his college career at The University of Georgia where he studied Mass Communications. At Georgia, he was a part of a then-school record Distance Medley Relay team that finished third in the SEC (1998). Day finished his college career at Belmont University. At Belmont, Day would go on to earn All-Conference honors in the Atlantic Sun Conference. In the fall of 2001, he earned All-South Regional Honors in cross country and set a then-school record for American-born runners in the 10K.

After college, Day was a part of the early days of a major recruiting service (college football). From 2006-2008 Day managed recruiting for the state of Georgia. In 2008, he started his own company, working with high school athletes in the recruiting process. He also was the voice of recruiting for two major radio stations in the Atlanta area. Day currently resides in Southwest metro Atlanta and is involved in real estate. This will be his third consecutive year doing color commentary for the Georgia Olympics for PlayOn! Sports.

GEORGIA OLYMPICS 400 METER DASH BEST PERFORMANCE

CHARLIE BELCHER TROPHY

Another fine American competitor to travel through Europe representing his country in fine style was Charlie Belcher. It all started at Georgia Tech in 1937, where, under Coach George Griffin, he developed into one of the nation's best 440 men. For three years he won the SEC 440 Yard championship and, in the course of doing so, set his school record of 46.7 which still stands. He was track captain in 1939 and on the side he won the SEC 220 Yard Low Hurdles and was champion of this event in 1938. Charlie Belcher had much talent and worked hard to become a great contributor to the early era of track. Yet, many, many years later, how many men have run 440 yards faster than Charlie's best of 46.7? Just a few.

In 1937, Charlie was elected, because of his collegiate career, to represent the U.S.A. in European competition. He performed as expected — winning most and conducting himself as an outstanding gentleman from the State of Georgia.

Member of Georgia Tech Athletic Hall of Fame; was three times total point champion in the Southeastern Conference Championship meet, held the SEC record 28 years for all-time individual points (50); was many years a co-holder of Georgia Tech 100 yard record of 9.6 and was also, for many years, holder of the Tech 220 hurdles record of 23.2. Set a world record for 100 yard dash for 34 year olds (9.5 in 1962). Second: He was Head Track Coach at Georgia Tech for 29 years and has coached many All-Americans, some of whom went on to be International Olympic contenders, Ben Vaughn, Joel Majors, Larry Lowe, and Antonio McKay.

SPEC TOWNS



SPEC TOWNS TROPHY

Either wearing the red and black of his University or the red, white and blue of his country, Spec Towns was the talk of the track world during the era of 1934-37. Almost every time he ran, a record fell. He was SEC High Hurdles champ in 1936 with a record of 14.1, set an Olympic record of 14.1 in Berlin among Nazi antagonism, and was the second Georgian to win a Gold Medal. No one really knows what Spec thought was his greatest show, but those that saw him do it rank his performance at the 1937 SEC Championship as his finest. Spec was first in the High Hurdles, first in the Low Hurdles, second in the High Jump, and third in the 100 yard dash. He left the High Jump to run the 100, went back to clear 6'0"; left to set a record in the highs, promptly returned to high jump 6'2" and later won the Low Hurdles — what an athlete! Lest we forget, Spec also made his name in the days of cinder tracks, without starting blocks and running over hurdles made of 1x4's mounted on an "A" frame. College and Olympic hurdles are 3" higher than high school hurdles, which also add to the impressive "fetes" of the great Spec Towns. Spec retired as track coach at the University of Georgia where he developed 18 SEC champions, many of whom are recognized in this program. In 1968, he was elected to Georgia Hall of Fame and the Helms Track and Field Hall of Fame.

We salute a great athlete, who brought honor to his school, state and nation, and a great citizen, who by his leadership brought the best out of many others.

FREDDIE FREDERIKSON TROPHY LESTER MICKENS, CO-HONOREE

This guy was awesome — not big, just plain "gutty." Frederikson always did better than he could. Freddie won the 1500 meters at the Junior National Championship at Princeton in 1936 as a high school senior qualifying for U.S. Olympic Track team tryouts. In 1938, he won the SEC Lightweight Boxing Championship and was voted the meet's outstanding boxer. He was captain of his team. But on the track, if you didn't have at least 25% more natural talent — look out, he'd beat you. Ask anybody that ran the mile in the South during 1938, '39 and '40. Freddie was the champion. His best time as 4:22.0 and in the top 10 in the U.S.A.

Lester Mickens, co-honoree of this event, was Best Performance Winner and record setter in Georgia Olympics IV & V. He was awarded the H. J. Stegeman Trophy in Georgia Olympic V.

PERRIN WALKER TROPHY

Perrin was one of the greats! From GMA he entered Georgia Tech and while there under the tutelage of George Griffin, he was a versatile stalwart. His best at Tech: 100 Yard Dash 9.5; 200 Yard Dash 20.8; Broad Jump 23' 6"; 440 Yard Dash 48.0; High Jump 6'3-1/2"; Shot Put 46' 10". He was Southeastern Conference champion in 1934 and was named to the All-American team in 1937 after having won the national 100 Meter Dash at Milwaukee. This team toured Europe with meets in Sweden, Norway, Denmark and Finland. Perrin was undefeated on the trip. His best 100 Meter Dash time was 10.4. In 1938, while competing in Chicago in the Daily News Meet, he set the world's record for the indoor 60 Yard Dash of 6.1 seconds and was holder (later co-holder) of this record for 20 years. The summer of 1983 (51 years after the State 200 Record!), he competed in the Masters Southwestern Classic at Furman University in Greenville, S.C. In this meet, Perrin placed first in the 100 meters — 17.9 seconds, and first in the 200 meters — 39 seconds. He ran in the 65-70 age group. Perrin also had a successful business career. He used to say that track meant a great deal to his life. He was honored with many medals and trophies, but in addition, track gave him opportunities to travel and, through his travel, many educational benefits came his way.

VASSA CATE TROPHY

Vassa Cate played first string halfback for three coaches at Georgia — Harry Mehre, Joel Hunt, and was Wally Butts' first captain in 1939. Vassa scored 8 touchdowns as a sophomore, all originating more than 30 yards away from the goal. He held the Sanford Stadium kickoff return record of 95 yards for 35 years. He also returned a kickoff against Mercer for 85 yards and had a 50-yard punt to beat Tulane 7 to 6. In track, Vassa was SEC 100 Yard Dash champion in 1938, 3rd in 1939, and 2nd in 1940. He was 2nd all three years in High Hurdles. He was SEC champion in 220 Low Hurdles in 1939 and in 1940 set a record that stood for 23 years at 23.1 seconds. He fell on the 8th hurdle in 1938 while leading the race.

Vassa was selected by Coach Mehre to the All Time All Mehre Team. He was elected to All Time All Southern Track Team. He was elected to State of Georgia Athletic Hall of Fame. He was voted outstanding player vs. Georgia Tech's '39 Orange Bowl Team. Vassa coached South Georgia All Stars in the Annual North-South Football Game. He coached at Riverside Military and his track team won G.I.A.A. He coached football and track at Waycross High and his track teams won 10 straight district and region championships. He served as principal of Calhoun High School for five years and served as Superintendent of Calhoun City Schools for 21 years. He retired in January of 1980.

Vassa Cate passed away at the age of 82 and will be missed by all.

STATE RECORD AWARD

This plaque will be awarded to anyone in any classification who ties or breaks the existing State record during the three days of the Georgia Olympics. It can be either in the preliminaries or the finals. If a record is broken in a preliminary heat and the new record is later broken in another preliminary heat, only 1 plaque will be awarded to the latter. If this record is broken in the finals, an additional plaque will be awarded. Record Plaques for Friday's field events and running preliminaries will be presented during the Final Session Opening Ceremonies, Saturday morning at 11:00 a.m. Plaques for Saturday finals will be shipped after the event.

BEST PERFORMANCE TROPHIES & MEDALLIONS

The trophies and medallions are for the best performance in each event, regardless of classification, and are given by the community of Jefferson. These awards are named for outstanding individuals who have excelled in their events.

TEAM TROPHIES

These are amongst the most coveted in the state. A trophy is awarded to the first four high point teams in each classification. These trophies will be presented at the conclusion of the meet on Saturday.



MORRIS M. BRYAN MEMORIAL TROPHY OUTSTANDING PERFORMER

In the spirit of how Morris conceived, guided and nurtured the Georgia Olympics, we wanted to name a trophy in memory of him. After much thought and consideration of a variety of ideas and approaches to the type recognition we wanted the trophy to be, we arrived at trying to select the outstanding performer that emerges from all of the sessions of the Georgia Olympics.

There were several ways this could be done. What we considered to be the fairest, most objective method is a point system as follows:

- Award 10 points for each Record Plaque won. If relay team on which he runs sets a record, score 2-1/2 points.
- Award 20 points for each Best Performance Trophy won. If relay team on which he runs wins the Best Performance Trophy, score 5 points to the individual.
- Award 1 point for each point scored by the individual in a final event.

The individual with the highest point total after the mile relay Saturday afternoon will be the winner. In the event of a tie, duplicate trophies will be awarded.

In the event of a tie, the winner will be selected on the basis of record set or the most outstanding performance amongst those trying.

HERMAN J. STEGEMAN was a prep and college star in four sports and later coached them all at the University of Georgia, but he always considered track his first love. As a collegiate middle-distance runner, he was a member of the University of Chicago national champion mile relay team. At Georgia, where he served as Director of Athletics, he coached the track team from almost the moment he set foot on the campus in 1919 until a year before his death in 1939.

MEET OFFICIALS

INSPIRED VOLUNTEERS RETURN TO JEFFERSON YEAR AFTER YEAR

Volunteers who work behind the scenes in any event are often unsung. They are always, however, vital to the execution of the event, no matter what type of occasion it may be.

The Georgia Olympics (the GHSO boys track and field state championship meet), are no different, as several volunteers congregate annually at Jefferson to make sure the meet runs as smoothly as Herschel Walker used to glide down the track. Men and women with varying backgrounds and fields of expertise have donated their time to be here, and many of these meet officials have been coming since the inception of the Georgia Olympics in 1972.

The meet officials oversee specific events, such as the pole vault, while others have more of a general role in monitoring conduct and handing out awards.

One thing the meet officials have in common is they have been asked back by the Georgia Olympics for multiple renditions of the annual affair. One of those gentlemen is Scott Tolbert, a Jefferson attorney who has been volunteering at the meet since high school.

"I was a pole vaulter at Jefferson," said Tolbert. "I started officiating in 1984. Coach (Jack) Keen asked me to assist at the pole vault event and I did. After a few years of college and law school, that got him a little more comfortable in my abilities to be an official and Coach Keen elevated me to head pole vault official. So that's basically what I have been doing for 30 years."

Other officials, such as Bolling DuBose, Gary Glenn, Raymond Hobby, Dennis Horne, William Howington, Richard Patterson, Scott Tolbert, Mike Van Winkle and Jeff Whitfield have been working the Georgia Olympics for as long or longer than Tolbert. All share one common reason for coming back: the enjoyment they get from officiating one of the most unique high school athletics events in the nation.

"The camaraderie amongst the folks, it takes a lot of people to run off that state track meet," said Howington, an official since 1972. "(Jefferson is) a small town and you know pretty much everybody and it's the same ones every year pretty much. I enjoy the whole

meet atmosphere. You have all the great athletes from every classification in one spot."

Morris Bryan, Jr. and brother Tom partnered with the city of Jefferson to get the event rolling in 1972, and it has been a raging success ever since. The meet is now woven into the fabric that is Jefferson.

"When it first started in Jefferson, it was kind of an oddity," said Howington. "But it's grown every year and it's become a point of pride for the people of Jefferson. It's a lot of state championships going on in one spot."

While Jefferson High School has been successful in many levels of high school athletics, most especially its wrestling program which boasts a whopping 29 state titles, the town of Jefferson has become synonymous with the Georgia Olympics.

MEMORABLE MOMENTS ...

Meet officials that have been here as long as Howington have witnessed some of the nation's best athletes. Since 1972, Roger Kingdom, Sam Graddy, Herschel Walker and Reese Hoffa, among many others, have graced the Georgia Olympics with their talents before representing their country in the international Olympics. While seeing these elite athletes in action was a thrill for those in attendance, some of the more memorable events were from lesser-known athletes.

"(Jefferson pole vaulter) Chris Keen was far and away the best by several feet and it was just an amazing sight to watch him vault," said Tolbert. "His approach to the pole vault was unbelievable to watch."

Keen competed in the Georgia Olympics from 1985-1988 for the Dragons before accepting a football scholarship to Florida State. Keen was also a state champion wrestler in high school.

Hiawatha Berry is a name not known by many, but his accomplishments at Jefferson provoke mythical comparisons. Berry was a star athlete at Winder-Barrow in the mid-80s who went on to play football for the Georgia Bulldogs, but not before sending shockwaves through the state of Georgia's track and field community.

"Hiawatha Berry was an unbelievable discus thrower," said Tolbert. "Where we were, stationed at the pole vault, we had to watch for his discus because it would fly over there where we're at. He was throwing the discus onto the track. It was incredible what he'd do."

Berry's discus throw of 197 feet, 10 inches still stands as the state's all-time record in the event. The throw not only shattered previous records, it left indelible memories in those who saw it.

"I was quoted in the AJC when Hiawatha Berry broke the state discus record, I told them I thought we'd have to splice the tapes together to measure it," said Gary Glenn, who has been involved in the Olympics since the beginning. "It was just a phenomenal throw."

Out of all the meet officials interviewed for this story, each of them recalled Berry's throw. But in addition to Berry's mammoth discus throw, one of the more famous athletes to compete in Jefferson made news in a sport many didn't think he competed in.

"Roger Kingdom was a great hurdler in the state of Georgia," said Dennis Horne, an official since 1972. "I had him in the discus. Not big, about 5-8, 160 pounds, and he ends up winning the discus."

It does not come as a surprise, to find out that Kingdom, who as Horne stated was a champion in hurdles, was the overall points leader for two consecutive Georgia Olympics (1980 and 1981) due to his mastery of not one, but multiple events.

Tolbert noted that while there has been a consistent flow of great athletes through Jefferson over the years, a few things have changed.

"Better athletes, stronger athletes and, probably more than anything, better coaching," he noted. "I think the coaches have done a heck of a job in coaching their competitors now."

Glenn said that while watching great athletes compete is a major draw to the games, seeing the honorary meet directors speak is awe-inspiring.

"I enjoyed watching Jessie Owens speak at one of the early (Georgia Olympics)," he said. "He was a great sprinter and long jumper himself."

MEN AT WORK ...

While watching the games as well as famous guests, officials still have a job to do. And at the Georgia Olympics, they fulfill their roles very well. Many track and field meets take place across the state throughout the school year, but the state meet is by far the most important - and credible - as state records can only be set and broken at the Georgia Olympics.

“We know we’ve got good officials,” said Glenn. “We know weather conditions are going to be monitored and we know things are going to be done right. We have people with vast experience running these things. One of the main things is seeing all the people of Jefferson coming together to do this, and they’ve been doing it since 1972.”

Each official has his own role to play. While the meet official at the pole vault has a set of rules to enforce, another at the track has an entirely different set of things to look for.

“What you look for mostly is the tape on the pole, the weight rating on the pole,” said Tolbert of his role as pole vault official. “A competitor is not supposed to have a pole rated lighter than his body weight. That is something we look for. The ability for the competitors not to get hurt is something else to (monitor) as well.”

Howington, meanwhile, has a much different job at the triple jump pit.

“In the triple jump, you have to watch and make sure they don’t take off in front of the toe board. And they have to land on the foot they took off from, they have to step, then jump into the pit and they can’t come out of the pit backwards,” he explained.

Glenn is at the shot put; a short, but intense field event that sometimes causes competitors to lose control of their emotions.

“I remember one time we had to disqualify a kid for uttering an expletive very loudly twice, and the head meet official happened to be standing right by me when he did that,” Glenn remembered. “It wasn’t muttered under his breath, so the ruling was we had to disqualify him.”

Meet officials, regardless of their individual functions, have an important role in the Georgia Olympics each year. Without their honest eyes and judicious minds, the much-anticipated event would not mean as much to the people of Georgia. As it stands, however, the job the officials carry out each year remains one of the main reasons why the Georgia Olympics is one of the most respected meets in all of high school sports.


